BALLOT QUESTION

“Shall the Clovis Municipal School District issue \$16,000,000 of general obligation bonds to erect, remodel, make additions to and furnish school buildings, purchase or improve school grounds, purchase computer software and hardware for student use in public schools, provide matching funds for capital outlay projects funded pursuant to the Public School Capital Outlay Act or any combination of these purposes?”

SOURCES OF CAPITAL FUNDS

The Clovis Municipal School District can partner with the Public School Facilities Authority (PSFA) on most major building projects in the District. This partnership results in the State funding approximately 80% of the cost of major building projects.

In the past five years, the District has received **\$21,434,550** in matching money from the State of New Mexico. The District expects to receive approximately **\$58,000,000** in New Mexico state funding over four years.

The District is currently in a positive position, which allows for authorization and sale of additional bonds that are critical to continuation of improvements and expansion of school facilities.

Approval of this general obligation bond will provide the 20% match to fund future facilities to be built in partnership with PSFA.

THE COST

BOND PROJECTS FUNDED

The following are projects that are in progress and have been funded, in part, with previous bond elections.

MARSHALL MIDDLE SCHOOL

Renovation to restrooms, classrooms in the north building, kitchen, cafeteria, locker rooms and replacement of special education classroom. Renovate courtyard areas, doors, windows, and abate asbestos.

LA CASITA ELEMENTARY

Nine (9) classroom additions and renovations throughout the building. Parking lot improvements, replace playground, roof replacement.

ARTS ACADEMY AT BELLA VISTA

Twelve (12) classroom additions, auditorium addition, renovations throughout remaining classrooms, kitchen, bathrooms, and cafeteria.

JAMES BICKLEY ELEMENTARY

In design for three (3) kindergarten classroom additions, parking lot replacement, renovations to remaining classrooms, kitchen, cafeteria, restrooms, and administrative offices.

LOCKWOOD ELEMENTARY

Replacement of entire facility.

ZIA ELEMENTARY

Roof replacement and day lighting.

IDENTIFIED PROJECTS

The Clovis Municipal School District continues to strive for the improvement of its instructional facilities and the equipment provided to our students. With the average age of our school buildings being 50 years, the proposed financing package is necessary to maintain an adequate and safe environment for our students. A strategic long-range facility plan was developed, and a committee of community members was established to review the plan and make recommendations to the School Board. The following areas would benefit from the proceeds of this bond issue:

- Computers and related technology in every school
- Repair/replacement of roofs
- Renovations to current buildings
- Repair/replacement of heating, cooling, and plumbing systems
- Parking lot improvements
- Telephone systems – upgrade to networking systems
- New Middle School
- New Lockwood Elementary School
