CLOVIS MUNICIPAL SCHOOLS ELEMENTARY & SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS TO PAY 5¢ MORE FOR REGULAR-PRICED LUNCHESES IN 2011-2012

Clovis Municipal Schools' students who buy regular-priced lunches will see a 5¢ per meal increase beginning in August with the 2011-2012 school year. Prices will increase from \$1.75 to \$1.80 per meal for elementary school students who buy regular-priced lunches and from \$2.00 to \$2.05 for secondary students.

Clovis Municipal Schools is required to comply with the United States Department of Agriculture's new provision, which mandates the price increase so that the amount paid for regular-priced meals is closer to their actual cost.

The price increase will only affect lunch prices.

Below are the student meal prices for the 2011-2012 school year:

Regular-Priced Meals for Students:

- Breakfast (Elementary/Secondary) - \$1.00
- Lunch (Elementary) - \$1.80
- Lunch (Secondary) - \$2.05

Reduced-Priced Meals for Students:

- Breakfast (Elementary/Secondary) - \$.30
- Lunch (Elementary/Secondary) - \$.40

The Arts Academy at Bella Vista, Cameo Elementary, Highland Elementary, James Bickley Elementary, La Casita Elementary, Parkview Elementary, and Marshall Middle School continue as Provisional II schools for the 2011-2012 school year, which means all students at the schools listed will automatically receive meals at no cost.

Students attending Lockwood Elementary School will submit free/reduced meal applications for the 2011-2012 school year in order to renew the school's Provision II status; however, students will receive meals at no cost for the upcoming school year.
